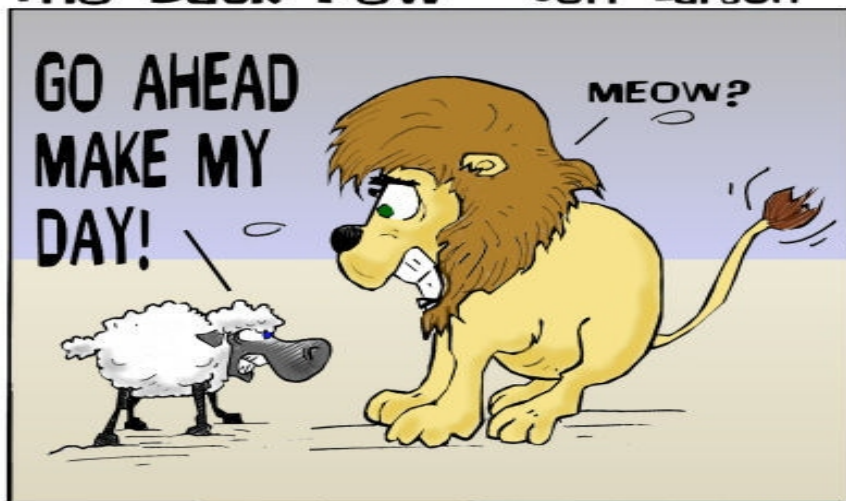

## Did You Know:

"El Shaddai" is a Contemporary Christian music song. It was written by Michael Card and John Thompson, using direct quotes from scripture as their inspiration, and recorded by Michael Card on one of his first two albums.

The title comes a Judaic name of God, usually translated as "God Almighty". Approximately half the lyrics of the chorus are in the Hebrew language, which is rather unusual for a Contemporary Christian song.

"El Shaddai" won "Song of the Year" and Card won "Songwriter of the Year" at the 1983 GMA Dove Awards. It was also named one of the "Songs of the Century" by the RIAA in 2001.

is version was notable for the solo violin used throughout the recording. El Shaddai is most often translated as "God Almighty."

El-Elyon na Adonai is a combination of two names for God, meaning "God Most High."

Erkamka na Adonai is taken from Psalm 18:1 except for the "na," which is added( and is normally translated "I love you, O Lord." Psalm 18:1 is the only place that the Hebrew Bible uses this verb for love in the Qal stem; this is normally an Aramaic usage. Hebrew uses this verb in the Piel stem.
